


The focus of this piece is a shop owned by my Dad. It used to be a cobbler's but is now an antique shop. This is how it went from a wreck to the building it is now.






This was a very difficult and dangerous part because they didn't just refurbish it they had to completely rebuild it because of the bad materials there already.

These are some of the materials used to rebuild it; Limestone, limestone stills (reclaimed), lime render (plaster), natural slate, wrought iron gutter and drainpipe, reclaimed parquet flooring and the window on the roof was going to be thrown in a skip.
